<b>Rule of Law</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Power of the king is limited</li> <li>• Separation of Church and State</li> </ul>	#1,12,14	(14) To obtain the general consent of the realm for the assessment of an 'aid' - or a 'scutage'(tax), we will cause the archbishops, bishops, abbots, earls, and greater barons to be summoned individually by letter... to come together on a fixed day (of which at least forty days notice shall be given) and at a fixed place.	Amendment: 1,2,3, 10	<b>Freedoms, Petitions, Assembly</b> Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press, or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.
<b>Fairness of Laws</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reasonable rules</li> <li>• Equal justice for all</li> <li>• Punishment in proportion to crim</li> </ul>	#20,21,40,	(20) For a trivial offence, a free man shall be fined only in proportion to the degree of his offence, and for a serious offence correspondingly, but not so heavily as to deprive him of his livelihood... None of these fines shall be imposed except by the assessment on oath of reputable men of the neighborhood.	Amendment: 4,8 & 9	<b>Right to a fair trial</b> In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed; which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the assistance of counsel for his defense
<b>Due process of law</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No trial without evidence/ testimony</li> <li>• Trial by jury of peers</li> </ul>	#39,38, 40, 60	(39) No free man shall be seized or imprisoned, or stripped of his rights or possessions, or outlawed or exiled, or deprived of his standing in any other way, nor will we proceed with force against him, or send others to do so, except by the lawful judgment of his peers (equals)or by the law of the land.	Amendment : 5, 6,7	<b>Bail, fines, punishment</b> Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted.
